Kent A. Greenes is a program director for The Conference Board Knowledge and Collaboration Council. Greenes initiated and directed BP's global Virtual Teamwork Program.

Greenes is executive in residence at George Washington University, an instructor at the U.S. Army War College in Carlisle and a faculty member at California State University at Northridge. He also serves on the advisory board of KMPPro, the editorial board of the Journal of Knowledge Management and is a member of The Conference Board Management Committee.
