Mark Lewis is Chief of Public Sector Partnerships at the World Justice Project, where he leads WJP's engagement and resource development cooperation with governmental and intergovernmental institutions. During this time, he led a major expansion of donor support to the IMF's capacity building initiatives across the globe, developing partnerships to deliver high-impact advisory services and training to member countries. His experience at the IMF also included economic policy work with many countries, and related communications, outreach and resource mobilization. Mr. Lewis served as the IMF representative in Turkey from 2010-2014.
