In addition, Ms. Robertson's commercial contract work includes advice to clients on both the UK Bribery Act and the US Foreign Corrupt Practices Act, particularly in the pharmaceuticals sector. This includes advice on employee training, pre-diligence customer/supplier clearance programs and post-contract audit rights, investigations and contract terminations. She provides similar assistance on anti-corruption issues during the diligence, negotiation and integration phases of M&A projects. Since much of her work involves government contracts and sub-contracts, she also advises on UK government procurement regulations.
