During this tenure, he was responsible for presenting all monthly, quarterly and annual finance reporting and budgeting to the EDS Board of Directors.

Pete continued in his financial capacity with a key role in the GM acquisition of EDS for the next several years, and in 1997 he was appointed Vice President of Purchasing for EDS, responsible for global acquisitions of \$10 billion dollars of products and services. As the Program Director for several financial Councils at The Conference Board, Pete now lends his expertise to over 150 members.
