Eric J. Pan is associate professor of law and director of The Samuel and Ronnie Heyman Center on Corporate Governance at the Benjamin N. Cardozo School of Law in New York. He is also an associate fellow of the Royal Institute for International Affairs (Chatham House) in London and a member of The American Law Institute. Prof. Pan conducts research on financial regulation, capital markets, corporate governance and international law. He directs the Chatham House City Series and frequently speaks about international financial and corporate law issues across North America, Europe and Asia. Before joining Cardozo, Prof. Pan was an attorney with Covington & Burling in Washington, DC, where he practiced corporate, securities, and international law. He also previously was a Jean Monnet Lecturer in Law at Warwick University, England, and a visiting fellow in international law at Cambridge University, England. He received a J.D. from Harvard Law School and an A.B. from Harvard College.
